

Jonah and the Whale

In the days of the great Assyrian Empire, there was a prophet, Jonah, who was not very pleased when God called him. "Jonah, I want you to go to the Assyrian capital, Nineveh," the Lord told him. "Preach to the pagans there. They're doing nothing but sinning against me."

Now Nineveh was a long way away. The Assyrians were a hard cruel race and Jonah – a Jew – didn't really care about foreigners anyway. "I'll run away to somewhere the Lord can't find me," he thought, packing a bag. Soon he was boarding a ship and setting off on a long voyage in quite the opposite direction to Nineveh – to Tarshish in Spain.



No sooner had the ship left the harbour and reached open waters than the skies darkened and the wind began to blow up. Great gusts whipped up the sea, rain lashed the masts and the ship was tossed up and down the towering waves, threatening to break up at any moment. Terrified, the sailors threw as much of their cargo overboard as they could to lighten the load, but the ship still bowed and cracked in the full force of the storm. "On your knees!" cried the captain. "Each one of you beg your gods to save us!" and he ran around the ship to check that everyone was praying.

"I'm a Hebrew," Jonah gulped. "The only thing that's going to save everyone is if you throw me overboard." Even though the sailors were desperate, they weren't murderers, and they did their best to row to shore. But it was impossible. With every stroke of their oars, the wind seemed to blow more strongly. In the end, they had no choice but to throw Jonah off the ship. As soon as the prophet had splashed into the water, the gale began to die down and the waves to subside.
