Keith had a superb knowledge of certain railways, not my GWR but what I would call his London Midland! He was a super friend and this occasion was on a steam hauled train to Holyhead.

Not only Keith but like Pat and me, Sheila came from River View Park which we need to remember initially threatened older traditional Gravesend. These fifty years on it is part of Gravesend. Sheila came to Christ Church first and my goodness they have made vast contributions to our life. Maybe we do need to remember that the Bible begins and ends in a garden which is itself a Riverview Park. (Some of you may well recall that I use this in funeral services when I suggest that heaven may well be viewed as a Riverview Park as it seeks to suggest descriptions of life eternally with God.) We certainly trust that Keith will have heard the Master's words, "Well done thou good and faithful servant."

I have been served by great Wardens! I am going to say (dangerously) Keith was the best. Dangerously because I would never rank friends and simply because they have all done so well by us. When I became vicar, after being a member of the congregation for many years, Keith and Michael Charles were the wardens. Keith had a vast appetite for work! Not simply paid employment but anything we needed doing he turned his many skills to. His skill and determination in master minding our planned giving and covenanting was exemplary.

Of course, all wardens knew my frailties........ rushing to judgements of best is one such frailty. All wardens have compensated those frailties so let us think of them all as one of those great displays in our wonderful paradisiacal flower festivals which owed so much to Sheila and supported so well by Keith.

If vicar and Wardens needed to meet anyone, Keith was there punctual and informed. He mastered any

brief totally. Like every Warden his loyalty and industry beyond were Keith's question. knowledge of the C of E and its ways of doing things superb. It will come as no surprise that his knowledge surpassed



mine. Like every Warden I have known Keith enjoyed a successful career and found time for us amidst a successful career and busy family life. Wardens look for the Archangel Gabriel when the Parish becomes vacant and vicars trust their Wardens are such Archangels. In my experience we were well and truly satisfied.

But there was much more to Keith! I find it hard to have to accept that there are parochial clergy who do not see the importance of Church schools! Keith gave very generously of his time as a very industrious, utterly reliable governor of Saint George's school. He willingly served in those areas of Governance which can be very difficult. As with his Wardenship, Keith was superb and a very grateful Chair contentedly left all to Keith. I should say two more things, Sheila was governor of another school which may join Saint Georges in Aletheia Anglican Academies Trust and while Keith served another Church School as governor. Other members of Christ Church served with us.

Keith was proud of his family. He shared their interests and enthusiasms. There was a time many years ago when Christ Church boasted many Open University Students in our ranks. Two of our Wardens Ron Curtis and Keith Knight (and I was a tutor for many years!). To sing the praises of Keith Knight is a pleasure. To rehearse the privileges of living within Christ Church a joy. To have the opportunities of recalling the many saints of our community a blessing.

Finally, Keith potter extraordinary (think of how frequently this is a Biblical image) struggling more with Standard Poodle Ben than the clay!

May Keith Knight rest in peace and rise in glory.

The Jar of Grace was initiated by the charity Unicef to encourage and enable churches to give support to their work with disadvantaged children around the Back in the days of the Social Responsibility Committee here at Christ Church it was agreed to use this idea for our own fund raising for our charity giving and to link it in with our Lenten Appeal. Some of you

may remember the little cardboard copper boxes kept at home which was added to this appeal. Maybe you still have one?

Your Giveaway Committee meets annually to decide which charities we would like to support each year - international, national and local. For 2020 we have agreed to divide the giving between CORD, Freedom from Torture, The David Knott Foundation, Community Domestic Abuse Programme (CDAP), and the Gravesham Street Pastors. The Lenten Leaflet will give more details. We also support Whitehill and Holy Trinity Primary Schools, Sanctuary, Larchwood Grove and Gravesend and District Osteoporosis Society, ADSS and many other local appeals. We also have an emergency appeals reserve.

Most of the income for this giving comes via the Lenten Envelope Appeal but other good causes - such as the Jar of Grace, jam and cakes sales etc. add to the total which in 2019 was £2,573.85.

Christ Church also raises money for Christian Aid, The Children's Society via the Christingle and the Food Bank. We are a giving community. If you have a charity you think we might consider supporting please do let us know.

In these days of contactless debit and credit cards, Apple Pay, online banking and so on it is easy not to bother with cash especially loose change but it is that loose change that can make all the different to the quality of someones life - that s not to say that paper/plastic contributions are not welcome! We hope you will be willing and able to support our Jar of Grace throughout 2020.

### Jesus turns towards Jerusalem

Jesus and his disciples had been travelling around Judea for three years. Every day they had walked for hours, relying on the goodness of strangers to feed and shelter them. They couldn't possibly seize him in the middle of his supporters. Instead they decided to wait and see whether Jesus would come to Jerusalem for the Passover.


The day came when Jesus asked two of his disciples to find a donkey for Him. When they came back with a donkey, Jesus mounted the animal which stood still and calm and
